## SANTA FE, NM

The *Objects of Art Santa Fe* is an all-encompassing show and sale with striking material from around the world available under one roof. The high-quality art is wide ranging, allowing new and established collectors to find ideal pieces to add to their collections. Highlighting the event is Native American art and ethnographic offerings.

Kim Martindale, co-producer of the show, says, "The *Objects of Art Show* is really putting out that it's this place people can come to and see things from different cultures and time periods, and they can respond to it."

More than 70 galleries and dealers will participate in the 2017 edition, which runs August 10 through 13 at El Museo Cultural de Santa Fe. Featured throughout their booths are thousands of items, including weavings, pottery, carvings, jewelry and more. Exhibiting this year are Buffalo Barry's Indian Art, Chimayo Trading, Frank Hill Tribal Arts, John Molloy Gallery, Mark Sublette Medicine Man Gallery, Peyote Bird Designs, Turkey Mountain Traders and Taylor Dale Tribal Art, among others.

"The *Objects of Art Show* allows us to 'stretch out,'" says Barry Walsh, owner of Buffalo Barry's. "We can combine antique and contemporary Hopi katsinam



with paintings by Phillip Vigil alongside Lao Buddhas. The overall theme is that of Spirit Beings from diverse cultures and time periods."

Medicine Man Gallery owner Mark Sublette adds, "The *Objects* show has a broad range of artwork from antique Native American to modernist paintings, and always has strong crowds of serious collectors who come to buy."

In addition to the exhibitor booths, attendees of *Objects of Art* can view special

showcases, such as *Homage to the Square* featuring early Navajo rugs and blankets from around 1870 to 1950 juxtaposed with modern works of art using simple polygon design and complex color interaction. The show is presented by Mark Sublette Medicine Man Gallery and the El Museo Cultural. Also on view is the pop-up exhibition *The World in New Mexico, New Mexico in the World* from Santa Fe's Museum of International Folk Art. For the first time, there will be a Designer Showcase displaying work from exhibitors booths in a modern interior, as selected by decorators the DUKE and I.

*Objects of Art Santa Fe* opens August 10 with a gala from 6 to 9 p.m. benefitting the New Mexico PBS, and then continues August 11 to 13 from 11 a.m. to 5 p.m. daily. ❧
